Reflection on the Jubilee of Artists

Read the following reflection out during Mass/within your faith communities over the weekend of 15 – 16 Feb 2025, or distribute for personal reflection.

As we celebrate the Jubilee of Artists, we look back to Pope Saint John Paul II's *Letter to Artists*, written in 1999, a message that remains profoundly relevant today. In this letter, the Pope acknowledged the divine gift of creativity, describing artists as co-creators with God, who through their work reveal glimpses of beauty, truth, and the transcendent. He reminded us that "beauty is the visible form of the good," and that art has the power to uplift the human spirit.

John Paul II called upon artists to continue the age-old relationship between faith and art, which has inspired humanity throughout history. He praised art as a means of expressing the inexpressible and helping humanity seek meaning and connection with the divine. "The world in





every age needs beauty," he wrote, emphasising the transformative role of art in countering despair and chaos.

Today, this call resonates as strongly as ever. At a time when division and uncertainty seem pervasive, the arts remind us of the shared humanity that unites us. The Jubilee of Artists invites us to celebrate those who bring beauty into our world—painters, musicians, writers, architects, and creators of every kind—and to reaffirm the importance of their work in reflecting the love and creativity of the Creator.

Let this Jubilee inspire not only artists but all of us to honour the sacred role of art. May we cherish its ability to stir our hearts, challenge our minds, and connect us to the divine. In doing so, we continue the legacy that Pope Saint John Paul II celebrated—a legacy of creativity, faith, and hope that transcends time.

Suggestions for celebrating this Jubilee in your communities

- Use the provided prayers of the faithful or write your own
 Craft prayers for the Jubilee that acknowledge and celebrate the contributions of artists.
 Pray for their inspiration, creativity, and courage. Recognise the role of art in bringing people closer to the divine and ask for God's blessings on all those who create beauty in the world.
- Read out the provided reflection on Pope Saint John Paul II's letter to artists

 Share the provided reflection on Pope Saint John Paul II's letter to artists during Mass or
 community events. You could also provide copies of the full letter for private reflection.

 Pope Saint John Paul II's words offer deep insight into the sacred nature of art and the
 role of the artist in the Church.
- Set up an art exhibition or invite local artists to display their works
 Organise a community art exhibition featuring local artists' work. This could include paintings, sculptures, photographs, or other forms of visual art. Create a space for the community to engage with and reflect on the divine spark in each piece of artwork, perhaps linking them to spiritual themes or experiences.
- Create an art-inspired prayer or meditation session
 Set up a session where participants can engage in quiet reflection or prayer while appreciating art. You could play music, display artworks, or invite an artist to create something live. This offers a space for deep spiritual connection through creative expression.





• Invite artists to lead workshops or talks

Host workshops or talks where local artists can share their craft and inspiration. These could be for specific art forms such as painting, sculpture, dance, or writing. Artists can also discuss how their work is influenced by their faith, encouraging others to use their own creativity as a form of spiritual expression.

Create an art and faith collaboration

Encourage local artists to collaborate on creating a piece of public art for the Church or community. This could involve a mural, stained glass, or a sculpture that reflects themes of faith, hope, and creativity. Involve the community in brainstorming ideas and offer opportunities for reflection on the final piece.

• Organise a creative prayer event

Hold a creative prayer event where participants can express their faith through art. Set up stations for people to create visual art, write poems, or even engage in dance or music. Encourage people to see their creativity as a prayer and a way of drawing closer to God.
