#### Reflection on the Jubilee of the World of Education

Read the following reflection out during Mass/within your faith communities over the weekend of 24 – 25 May 2025, or distribute for personal reflection.

The Jubilee of the World of Education is a chance to reflect on the significant role our Catholic schools play in supporting the mission of Jesus by sharing his Good News with the young people in their care and their whānau. At the centre of Catholic education is the encounter with Jesus, as highlighted by the New Zealand Catholic Bishops Conference in the 2014 document *The Catholic Education of School-Age Children*.

While we are part of the global network of Catholic schools, our schools are shaped by our Aotearoa New Zealand context. It is important to acknowledge the dedication, sacrifice, and financial input of earlier generations who laid the foundation of our vibrant Catholic schools today. In the Palmerston North Diocese, we have 26 Catholic primary schools and 8 Catholic colleges, including the only two Catholic Māori boarding colleges in the world.

In each of our schools, our young people strengthen their understanding of what it means to belong to the Catholic school community, but also beyond that to the Church community of faith. Our schools are at the heart of each parish community.

Let's pray that our school-parish communities will be shared places of welcome, hospitality, learning, and prayer so that we may be people of the Good News.

  Share prayers or special blessings during school assemblies, Mass, and gatherings to recognize the value of education and its impact on young minds.
- Share a Reflection on the Role of Education in Faith and Life
  Offer a reflection at Mass or community events, focusing on how education shapes
  lives, fosters compassion, and builds pathways toward faith and knowledge.
- Invite Students to Participate in a Special Youth Mass
  Hold a Mass led by students, with readings, music, and prayers presented by young
  people to celebrate their role in the community.
- Offer a Blessing for All Students and Teachers

  Conclude Mass or gatherings with a special blessing over students, teachers, and all involved in education, invoking God's guidance for the academic year.
