Reflection on the Jubilee of Priests and Bishops

Read the following reflection out during Mass/within your faith communities over the weekend of 28 – 29 June 2025, or distribute for personal reflection.





The Jubilee year has prompted me to think seriously about my first calling to the priesthood many years ago and the incredible journey of faith and life since that first call. During my seminary training, I often wondered why God had chosen me when I saw many other students come and go, many of whom were so gifted and seemed much more suited to the priestly life than me. I eventually came to stop questioning God's plan for me and instead became grateful for it!

After ordination, the real journey began for me because I quickly came to realize that in the diocesan priesthood, the people's journey of faith and life is also the priest's journey, and so it is my journey. The people's ups and downs, joys and sorrows, hopes and aspirations are all the fabric of my life too because I journey with them in all of that. I am so grateful to all those who have encouraged and educated me in the ways of God through their faith-filled lives. They are truly pilgrims of hope!

Suggestions for celebrating this Jubilee in your communities

- Use the provided prayers of the faithful or write your own

 Craft prayers specifically for priests, focusing on their ministry, spiritual growth, and the strength they need to serve their communities.
- Use the other prayers during gatherings throughout the week Incorporate prayers for priests and bishops in all community events, asking for God's guidance, strength, and wisdom as they serve the Church and their parishioners.
- Read out the reflection during mass or in your faith communities or have copies of it available for private reflection
 - Share a reflection during Mass or other gatherings to honour the vocation of the priesthood, and make printed copies available for personal meditation.
- Display names or photos of the priests in your communities

 Highlight the priests serving in your community by displaying their names or photos in a place where the parish can easily see them and offer prayers for them.
- Host a 'meet and greet' with the priests in your communities

 Organise an informal gathering where parishioners can meet and engage with the priests, offering a chance for connection and appreciation.
- Start a prayer chain praying for the priests in our diocese
 Encourage members of your community to commit to a prayer chain, lifting up the ministry of our priests and bishop in your daily prayers.
- Invite your local priests to speak about their vocation to the priesthood Host a special event or talk where local priests can share their stories of calling, formation, and service to inspire others.
