A LEGACY OF FAITH

St Patrick's Church in Ōkato has stood as a beacon of faith and community since its founding in the late 19th century. The original church was established in 1880, with construction completed in 1881. It was designed by French diocesan priest Fr Etienne Chastagnon, and built on one acre of land generously donated by Dennis Doyle.

The church was formally opened and dedicated to St Patrick on 4 May 1881, during a mission preached by Fr Theo LeMemant des Chesnais. That same year marked the beginning of the Māori Mission in Ōkato, established by the Society of Mary.
